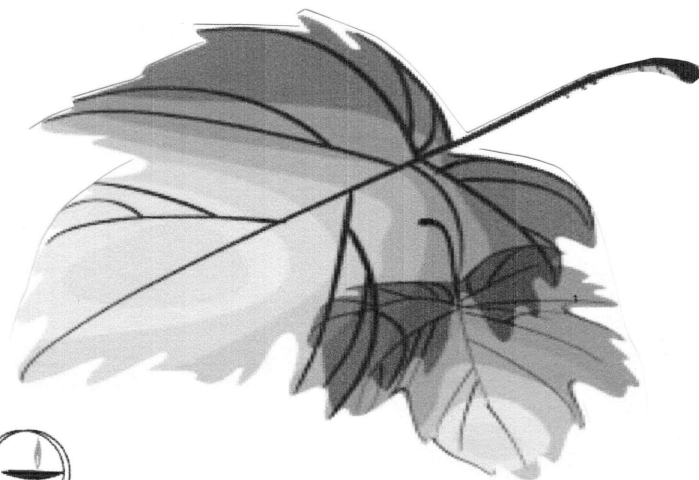

How This Works:

The goal of this auction/celebration is to have fun, strengthen our May community, and raise funds for our day-to-day operations. We have tried to create an event which will be exciting and enjoyable, organized and comprehensive.* We have tried to put together a catalog which is as straightforward and streamlined as possible, while still providing all the necessary information. The auction items have been collected with great thought. Some items are whimsical and creative; others are more practical and utilitarian. We have drawn upon the generous talents and energies of over 50 members of our community. Additionally, we have tried to arrange an event which will be enjoyable in and of itself. The bar will be open from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm (cash only) and complimentary hors d'oeuvres and sweets will be available until they have all been consumed! There will be cafe seating available.

In order to encourage participation by as many members of our May community as possible, we have listed many “**Buy It Now**” (BIN) options (see specific listings for this classification). We encourage those of you who are unable to attend on November 17, to give these items special attention, at your earliest convenience. The first person to contact Jennifer Newman and commit to the **Buy It Now** price before the auction will be the “winning bidder” for that item; arrangements for payment will be made with Jennifer. If there is an item you “must have”, but it is **not a Buy It Now** item, and you are not able to attend on the night of the auction, contact Jennifer about proxy-bidding opportunities.

For everyone attending the auction on Nov. 17th, you will be assigned a Bidder Number. Every item in the catalog has an Item Number, and there will be a Bid Sheet for that item. Bid Sheets will be clearly marked, with an abbreviated description of the item, but due to display considerations not all Bid Sheets will be right next to their corresponding item. Please make sure the Bid Sheet you enter your Bidder Number on corresponds to the item you desire. Additionally, when bidding on something which you will NOT be carrying home with you after the auction (e.g. desserts to be made at future dates; lessons or adventures, or any item of "Practical Magic") please be familiar with **all** information about that item in the catalog before bidding.

Each Bid Sheet will have an indication for the Starting Bid Amount, and appropriate Bid Increments. The auction bidding will begin at 6:00 pm. Bidding on most items will be allowed until 8:00 pm, but there may be one or two clearly marked tables for which bidding will end as early as 7:30 pm. At 8:00 pm, all Bid Sheets will be collected and tallied. The bar will remain open until 9:00 pm. We will do our best to streamline the payment process (cash and checks ONLY) but you should plan on enjoying yourselves for up to an hour after the official auction portion of the event is over. Payment is expected the night of the auction. Unless otherwise specified, future items must be redeemed within one year.
