

Our Board member, Peter Cannavo, will speak about Nobel Peace Prize winner Wangari Maathi, founder of the Green Belt Movement, a grassroots organization, focusing on women planting trees to conserve the environment and improve the quality of their lives. Beginning in 1976 in Kenya, when Wangari planted nine trees in her own backyard, it has grown into a Pan-African movement resulting in women planting more than 20 million trees in their own back yards and school and church compounds. Wangari is internationally recognized for her environmental movement emphasizing green values and social justice.

Greeting and Salutations Beloved Community!

As I mentioned at the Board of Trustees meeting with the congregation last month, we have submitted our application for an interim minister to the UUA Transitions Office. The next step in the Interim search process will be early in May, when congregations receive the names (and resumes) of interested ministers. Then, on Friday, May 20th, at exactly noon, Eastern Time, congregations can make an offer to an available minister!

If we don't get a minister in round 1, we go to round 2, when in late May, we will receive names of interested ministers without a match! And then on June 3rd, noon Eastern Time, we can make an offer!

There is a round 3, but at that point the process is much more casual, as people and congregations fall into place—or not. I am not considering being in the "not" category! (*I've put in for having Friday May 20th off—from my other full time job!*)

No matter whom we hire to be our interim minister, I am confident that they will be able to serve us well, as we enter into a formal search for a settled minister.

I've done a lot of reading around the UUA web site, and I ran into some information that's a great resource for all things regarding ministers, including these two gems (from *The UUMA Guidelines for the Conduct of Ministry*):

"The tasks of ministry are too numerous for one individual to fulfill. Successful ministry requires the effective use of time by a minister. Ministers will determine the emphases of their ministries, and the weekly and annual structure of their time, on the basis of their interests and skills, as well as the needs of the people and institutions they serve and the demands of love and justice in the world."

Ministers are responsible for monitoring the boundaries of their work and energy, and for educating those they serve as to the structures of time that best protect their well-being and the quality of their ministry. In general a minister should be free to decide the organization and priorities of their own time, and consult with the governing body of congregations and agencies and/or their supervisors around these matters."

I can tell you first hand that keeping the interests of May Memorial's spiritual, financial, and governance structures at the forefront of my mind—and running smoothly—is exhausting work! (*I'm still having fun—but it's exhausting!*) I would rate time management skills as an essential ingredient to being a successful minister (*second only to having good boundaries!*)
